



To make a 2-sided copy, follow your printer's instructions for loading the sheet of paper back into your printer and then press the PRINT button again. A single letter is pronounced like a single letter of the American alphabet. For example, "A" is pronounced "A" and not "Ah". Just read the phonetics as if you were reading American English. We also give pronunciation clues for made-up words such as "Rhymes with" and "as in". A dot • between 2 phonetic syllables means say the two phonetic words on either side of the dot • very fast like one word. We recommend that you review the card before using it and practice with a native speaker.

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
